PREPARE NOW - LEARN HOW!

How will I be notified of an emergency?

- Radio
- Television
- Automated Telephone Call

What should I do if notified?

GO – inside and turn on your radio or television

LISTEN – to the media reports

FOLLOW – instructions provided by the Province

What instructions might I receive?

- Evacuate
- Shelter-in-Place
- Take Potassium Iodide (KI) Pills
- Report to a Reception Centre for Monitoring

Remember...

- Stay Calm
- Don't Evacuate - unless advised to do so
- Avoid Using the Phone - unless reporting a 911 Emergency
