COVID-19 Vaccine: Fifth Dose Eligibility

On May 2, 2022, the Ministry of Health **expanded** booster dose eligibility to include a second booster (**fifth dose**) for individuals who are **moderately to severely immunocompromised** and received a **3-dose primary series**.

These immunocompromised individuals must also belong to one of the following groups:

- Individuals 60 years of age and older
- First Nations, Inuit and Métis individuals and their non-Indigenous household members aged 18 and over
- Residents of long-term care homes, retirement homes, elder care lodges and older adults living in other congregate settings

The interval for second booster (fifth dose) is as follows:

- Individuals 60 years of age and older
 - recommended interval of at least 140 days (five months) after receiving their first booster (fourth dose). With informed consent, individuals may receive a fifth dose at a minimum interval of 84 days (3 months) after their first booster dose.
- First Nations, Inuit and Métis individuals and their non-Indigenous household members aged 18 and over
 - recommended interval of at least 140 days (five months) after receiving their first booster (fourth dose). With informed consent, individuals may receive a fifth dose at a minimum interval of 84 days (3 months) after their first booster dose.
- Residents of long-term care homes, retirement homes, elder care lodges and older adults living in other congregate settings
 - recommended interval of at least 84 days (three months) after receiving their first booster (fourth dose).
