Tdap Maternal Program

As of April 01, 2022, Ontario's Tdap (Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis) immunization program expanded to include one publicly funded dose in every pregnancy irrespective of Tdap immunization history. With this expansion Ontario is protecting those who are pregnant, but especially newborns who are too voung to be vaccinated and are at high risk of severe outcomes following a pertussis infection.

The Canadian National Advisory Committee on Immunization (NACI) recommends the following:

- Tdap vaccine should ideally be provided between 27 and 32 weeks of gestation, which is supported by the strongest safety and effectiveness data.
- Evidence also supports providing maternal Tdap over a wider range of gestational ages. Tdap immunization may be provided from 13 weeks up to the time of delivery based on unique patient considerations such as risk of preterm birth.
- Due to rapid waning of maternal antibodies, Tdap vaccination should be offered in each pregnancy irrespective of immunization history or the interval between pregnancies.
