It's Time to Fall Back—Change your Batteries for the Fall!

It is time to replace the batteries in your vaccine thermometers. For a more accurate reading, batteries should be changed every 6 months. A good reminder is to change them with every daylight-saving time (DST) change. This fall, DST will end on Sunday, November 6, 2022, at 2:00 AM.

Please indicate on your next vaccine order if you need new batteries. They will be provided for pick-up with your next vaccine order.

Vaccine Storage & Handling Tips:

- Order a one-month supply of vaccine at a time.
- Check expiry dates frequently to ensure vaccines with the earliest expiration dates are used first.

 Expired vaccines should be removed from the vaccine fridge immediately and returned to the

 Durham Region Health Department (DRHD) with a completed "Vaccine Return Form" (Found on durham.ca/hcp > then "Reporting").
- Store all vaccines and diluent in their original packaging and protect them from light.
- In the event of a cold chain incident (CCI) or power failure, ensure a **contingency plan is arranged** with supplies readily available. Contingency supplies include extra coolers, ice packs, water blankets and thermometers to ensure vaccine is always stored between **+2.0** to **+8.0** degrees Celsius.
- Contact DRHD immediately if vaccine fridge temperatures are not within +2.0 to +8.0 degrees
