Influenza and COVID-19 XBB Vaccines Now Available for Everyone

Influenza and COVID-19 XBB vaccines are now available to order for the general population. Individuals six months of age and older are encouraged to receive both the COVID-19 and influenza vaccines as soon as possible. Respiratory viral illness season typically runs from October to April. Check out our Respiratory Virus Data Tracker at durham.ca/resptracker to see the status of COVID-19 and influenza cases in Durham Region throughout the season.

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Ordering Reminders for Influenza Vaccines

- Place orders for a one-month supply by visiting durham.ca/Health/Order-Influenza-Vaccines-Online.
- To ensure equitable distribution, DRHD may adjust order quantities and/or substitute products based on site specific 2022/2023 influenza vaccine administration data and supply availability.
- **Do not delay vaccination for a particular vaccine product.** Any of the available influenza vaccines would be preferable to remaining unvaccinated.

Co-Administration

Consider co-administration of COVID-19 and influenza vaccines as able and appropriate. **Influenza** vaccines may be administered at the same time, before, or after COVID-19 vaccines and routine vaccines in individuals six months of age and older. It is recommended to administer the vaccines in separate limbs or separate the injection sites by at least 2.5 cm (1 inch). Currently, there are no studies on the co-administration of Shingrix® with Fluad® or Fluzone® High-Dose Quadrivalent. With Fluad®, it is unknown how the adjuvants may interact with Shingrix®.

There are two exceptions. Influenza and COVID-19 vaccines should not be co-administered with Imvamune vaccine for mpox and the Arexvy vaccine for RSV. Avoiding co-administration is suggested to help ensure accuracy of AEFI reporting.

- A 4-week interval is recommended between administration of Imvamune and COVID-19 vaccine.
- A 2-week interval is recommended between administration of Imvamune and influenza vaccine.
- A 2-week interval is recommended between administration of Arexvy and either influenza and/or COVID-19 vaccines.

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Ensuring Every Dose Counts

DRHD recognizes the critical role of primary care in safeguarding public health, especially during the respiratory illness season and it is important to highlight the shared responsibility to minimize vaccine waste and make sure every dose counts. Ensure vaccine waste is kept to a minimum by:

- Ordering only a **one-month supply** at a time.
- Considering projected vaccine needs, including patient demographics and current demand.
- Committing to proper cold chain maintenance and **ensure a plan is in place to monitor vaccine during staff absences**. Report cold chain breaks immediately by calling 905-668-7711 ext. 3063.
- Ensuring doses ordered are doses administered.

Addressing Vaccine Hesitancy

Health care providers (HCPs) play an important role in vaccine acceptance and the success of vaccine programs. Public Health Ontario (2021) identified key principles HCPs can use when engaging in conversations about vaccines:

- Be empathetic and understanding of the patient's unique situation.
- Present vaccination as the default approach early on (e.g., "we are going to give your flu shot today" instead of, "would you like your flu shot?").
- Ask patients about any questions or concerns they have and request their permission to share facts.
- Address misinformation by sharing key facts and not repeating the myth as this may reinforce it.
- Give your strong recommendation as clients see you as a trusted source.
