Opioid Use in Primary Care Virtual Conference - CAMH

There is strong evidence that Opioid Agonist Treatment (OAT) leads to reduction or cessation of illicit opioid use and can allow for patients to achieve sustained long-term remission. Keynote Presentation: Drug Policy in Canada and a Novel Fentanyl Powder Sales Program

Dr. Christy Sutherland is a family doctor and diplomat of the American Board of Addiction Medicine who works in Vancouver's Downtown East Side providing care to Canada's most vulnerable population. Dr. Sutherland is the Medical Director of the PHS Community Services Society where she leads a team of physicians and nurses who are embedded in low barrier, harm reduction projects. She received her MD at Dalhousie University and completed her Family Medicine Residency at UBC in 2010. Dr. Sutherland was recognized as the 2018 British Columbia Family Physician of the Year, as well as the recipient of a City of Vancouver Award for Excellence in 2019.
