

Potassium iodide tablets in Durham

The Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission requires that all homes and businesses within 10kilometres of a nuclear generating station receive a supply of potassium iodide (KI) tablets. KI is a stable iodine salt, effective in reducing the risk of thyroid cancer in the highly unlikely event of a radioactive iodine release.

In October 2015, KI tablets were pre-distributed to homes and businesses within 10-kilometres of the Pickering and Darlington nuclear generating stations. There is an on-going process in place to ensure that new residents and businesses who have moved into the 10-kilometres zone and registered their new address with Canada Post, are mailed a free supply of KI tablets.

Tablets have also been pre-distributed to all institutions (school boards, private schools, child care centres, long-term care and retirement homes, hospitals, youth detention centres) and first responders located within 10-kilometres of either nuclear generating station.

In the highly unlikely event of a nuclear emergency that results in the release of radiation to the public, the **Chief Medical Officer of Health** will provide **instructions** on where, when, how and by whom KI tablets should be taken.

As a health care provider, we want to thank you for partnering with us as you help to raise awareness about KI by:

- Advising your clients/patients who live or work within 10 to 50 km of a nuclear generating station, that they can obtain a FREE supply of KI tablets from preparetobesafe.ca or, they can call the Durham Health Connection Line 905-668-2020, 1-800-841-2729 for additional information about KI tablet distribution and assistance in ordering. Preparetobesafe.ca uses postal codes to determine if an address falls within the eligible zone.
