# **Smart Cities Challenge**

In November 2017, Infrastructure Canada announced the federal Smart Cities Challenge, inviting Canadian municipalities, including regional governments and Indigenous communities, to collaborate with residents, businesses, and community organizations, to adopt a smart cities approach using data and connected technology to address local issues.

This forum will be the first of a series of public engagement activities undertaken by the Region as it collaborates with key stakeholders to develop and submit an application for Infrastructure Canada's next round of the Smart Cities Challenge, which is anticipated to be launched in 2019.
