- Driven by the requirements of CNSC RegDoc 2.10.1 and Provincial Nuclear Emergency Response Plan (PNERP)
- Implement and maintain emergency response capability within OPG Nuclear
- Maintain OPGN Emergency Response Organization (ERO) facilities and equipment
- Oversee the ERO training and qualification program, and roster of qualified staff
- Conduct drills & exercises to confirm effectiveness of emergency plans
- Liaise with off-site authorities and stakeholders to align and integrate emergency plans

o CNSC, Province, Region of Durham, City of Toronto, etc.

• Assessments conducted to demonstrate program performance and continuing improvement

o Internal: Self Assessments, Nuclear Oversight

o External: CNSC inspections, Nuclear Safety Review Board, WANO, IAEA EPREV

### **EP Pillars**

#### **1. Program Excellence**

Strengthen OPG's social license through a robust EP program which is integrated with station goals, to ensure the protection of employees, the public and the environment

#### 2. Perfect Practice

Maximize the Emergency Response Organization's effectiveness through drills and exercises that are realistic, challenging and evaluated against a high standard

#### 3. Constant Improvement through Innovation

Develop a culture of continually challenging the status quo to improve the EP program through a cycle of: Ideation  $\rightarrow$  Innovation  $\rightarrow$  Integration  $\rightarrow$  Iteration



## 2020 Highlights

- **Drills & exercises:** Successfully completed drills with all crews at Pickering and Darlington, plus 1 inter-operability exercise, use of virtual platforms, revised protocols for drill control/evaluation, and new drill scenario elements
- **COVID**: Enhanced cleaning and staff protection protocols within Emergency Response Organization (ERO), revised assembly & accounting protocols, virtual response guidelines, cross trained ERO to build additional resiliency
- KI Pills: Delivered an unprecedented number of KI pills to requesting residents & businesses
- **External assessments**: WANO at Darlington concluded the strength of OPGs EP program, plus several lessons learned to continually improve
- Innovation: Several new technologies, tools, streamlined processes implemented in 2020 to improve service delivery Cloud based data management, drill evaluation tablets, virtual training, technology refresh in response facilities to improve effectiveness
- Transportation Emergency Response: Revised Mutual Aid Agreement between Canadian utilities
- **Resilience**: Delivered resilience training for key ERO decision makers

## **2021** Priorities

- Drills & exercises: Continued implementation of full drill schedule through pandemic, including new and challenging drill scenarios
- **Partnerships**: Maintain strong partnerships with external partners through regular discussion and alignment
- External evaluations: CNSC audits, 2021 Pickering WANO evaluation
- **Technology**: Upgrades to emergency communication software tools (WebEOC)
- Innovation: Offsite Survey Team restructuring, adoption of new software and technology
- **Organization**: Redesigning organization to build capability and agility
- **Resourcing**: Building proficiency of several new staff to department to improve organizational agility
- New Nuclear & SMRs: Supporting OPGs SMR initiative with staff and expertise on EP issues
