Restoration Continues

- Focus on restoration
- Tree planting to be complete by end of 2022
 - o South Site: 9,000 planted of 11,000
 - North Site: 7,000 planted of 10,000
- Other activities include:
 - Decon & removal of site infrastructure
 - Road grading
 - Removing laydown areas
- Upcoming activities
 - Construction of berm on west side of WWTP







Removal of Site Infrastructure

- Lakeshore Road realignment
- Removal of infrastructure, internal roads
- Removal of Lakeshore underpass
- Contractor demobilization









Port Granby Phase 3 - Long-Term Monitoring



Waste Water Treatment

- East Gorge groundwater collection
- Port Granby Project Waste Water Treatment Plant: storage mound leachate, East Gorge groundwater collection
- Plant output safely transported licensed, offsite storage



Long-Term Waste Management Facility Monitoring

- Site remains fenced
- Mound surface, internal sensors monitored
- · Grounds monitored, maintained



Environmental Monitoring

 Air, water, groundwater, soil, plants, wildlife monitoring continues



Continued Safety Oversight

- Plans in place to ensure any event is properly managed
- Minimize risk to people, environment

Port Granby Nature Reserve Proposal

- AECL considering collaborative vision for surplus lands surrounding storage mound
- December meeting AECL staff with representatives of Alderville First Nation, Curve Lake First Nation, Hiawatha First Nation, Mississaugas of Scugog Island First Nation, SECRA, MOC and MPH
- Discussed considerations for proposal focus on stewardship plans, governance options
- AECL established Port Granby End-Use Working Group to continue discussion on goals and objectives

Consolidating PHP & PGP Licenses → Single, 10-Year Licence



Continue cleanup

of historic low-level radioactive waste from various sites in Port Hope for safe, long-term containment and monitoring



Continue maintenance/monitoring

of capped and closed Port Granby Long-Term Waste Management Facility



Reduce administrative burden

of holding two separate licences for similar projects under PHAI portfolio
