# Ethambutol

## **Reasons for taking this medicine**

Ethambutol is used to treat **tuberculosis** (TB). It is used with other TB drugs.

## How to take this medicine

- It is very important that you take ethambutol exactly as ordered
- If you think you might be pregnant, or you are breastfeeding, tell your doctor
- If you miss a dose, take it as soon as possible but **<u>never</u>** take two doses at one time
- Ethambutol can be taken with or without food
- Do not drink alcohol while taking ethambutol

## Caution

- Tell your doctor and pharmacist if you have any **drug allergies** before starting ethambutol
- Always tell your doctor and pharmacist if you are taking other medicines or vitamins
- Tell your doctor if you have ever had kidney disease, gout, pre-existing optic neuritis, eye disease, or any visual changes (e.g., cataracts, changes in colour recognition)
- Do not store ethambutol in areas where there is direct sunlight, heat or moisture
- Keep all follow up appointments with your doctor in order to check your response to ethambutol
- Have your blood work done as ordered by your doctor to check your liver

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Most people can take ethambutol without any problems. Ethambutol may have some side effects.

Tell your doctor if you have:

- Loss of appetite
- Nausea and vomiting
- Stomach pain
- Metallic taste
- Swelling of face
- Fever, chills
- Headache, dizziness, confusion
- Joint pain, gout

**<u>Stop</u>** taking ethambutol and call your doctor **right away** if you have the following symptoms:

- Blurred or changed vision
- Inability to see the colours: red or green
- Eye pain
- "Spots" in your vision
- Signs of an allergic reaction: hives, difficulties breathing, swelling of face, lips, tongue or throat
