Fridge Check: Have you Changed your Batteries?

Vaccine thermometer batteries should be changed every six months to ensure fridge monitoring is accurate and cold chain is maintained. Spring is also a great time to organize and clean your vaccine fridge.

Fridge Checklist:

- □ Change thermometer batteries.
- □ Check expiry dates for all vaccines and diluents.
- □ Remove expired products from the fridge.
- Return all expired non-COVID-19 products to the Durham Region Health Department (DRHD) with a <u>completed Vaccine Return Form</u> (or find the Vaccine Return Form at durham.ca/hcp then Forms and Reporting). Expired COVID-19 vaccine should be disposed of by the administering organization.
- □ Store vaccines in the original packaging and organize by product, ensuring vaccines with the closest expiry date are used first.
- □ Maintain space between vaccines to allow for air circulation and store vaccine on internal shelves.
- □ Ensure no food, beverages, or specimens are in the vaccine fridge. Cold water bottles are permitted to assist with the regulation of fridge temperatures.
- □ Defrost freezers.
