How to Play


- At your own pace and by choosing your own route, ride your bike to each location identified on page two of this document. You can use this online map to see where the clues are located.

Cycling Photo Scavenger Hunt Whitby Edition

Clues

Clue #1 - This house is now a museum on the waterfront - it was home to Whitby's first mayor. Take a selfie on the porch, wearing your helmet with the hashtag #WhitbyBikeMonth.

Clue #2 - This Community Centre on Myrtle Road was built in 1861 and has a different style of stonework on each wall. It served as a school for 105 years before being bought by Whitby for \$2 and converted to a community centre. Post a picture of the centre through your front wheel with the hashtag #WhitbyBikeMonth.

Clue #3 - What is your favourite place to buy your cycling gear in town? Share a photo of where you can shop for bikes and post it with the hashtag #WhitbyBikeMonth.

Clue #4 - This is Whitby's northernmost library. Post a picture of your bike in the library's distinctive bike racks with the hashtag #WhitbyBikeMonth.

Clue #5 - Bike repair stands are being added to help cyclists keep their bikes safe and operational. Take a pic of your bike on any of the town's bike repair stands and post it with the hashtag #WhitbyBikeMonth.

Clue #6 - This log cabin in Cullen Central Park was originally built in 1830 in Orangeville, then moved here in 1981. It is a designated Ontario heritage building. Take a pic of the cabin with your bike and post it with the hashtag #WhitbyBikeMonth.

Clue #7 - Got a favourite place to ride? Post a picture of yourself at your go-to Town of Whitby cycling destination with the hashtag #WhitbyBikeMonth.

Clue #8 - This memorial commemorates the site of a military camp in Whitby where prisoners of war were held and where spies were trained. Post a picture of your helmet at the memorial with the hashtag #WhitbyBikeMonth.

Clue #9 - Whitby has been building Multi-Use Paths (MUPs) to allow cyclists to travel safely through town on busy streets. These double-wide asphalt paths are found along major roads like Garden Street, Rossland Road, Taunton Road and other places in town. Post a picture of an MUP in Whitby with the hashtag #WhitbyBikeMonth.

Clue #10 - Who is your favourite riding buddy? With their permission, post a pic of your best cycling friend and tag it #WhitbyBikeMonth.
