

# **Shoreline Homeowners**



## How can you protect your shoreline property?

Floods happen in Durham Region, and climate change is bringing wetter and wilder weather to the area. If your property is located near the shores of a water body, rising water levels, storm surge driven by extreme winds, and erosion can pose a significant risk to you, your family, and your home.

### **Get Flood Ready**

If you rent or own property in Durham Region along a shoreline:

- Determine if your property is located within a flood hazard area by using the **floodplain viewer**.
- Learn about flood messaging and watershed conditions from your <u>local Conservation</u>
   <u>Authority.</u>
- Find out about erosion control and shoreline protection techniques from your local Conservation Authority, such as <u>this locally relevant website</u> from Kawartha Conservation.
- Learn about flood evacuation alerts and orders for your area through your Conservation Authority and through <u>Durham Emergency Management Office</u> (DEMO).
- Speak with your insurance broker to find out what is covered.

### **Acting Now Saves Money Later**

Every **\$1 invested today** in protecting your home and property can save you up to **\$6 in avoided costs** when recovering from extreme weather impacts such as flooding. Your local Conservation Authority and municipality are also taking action to identify areas at risk, reduce those risks, and support residents.

#### Don't be Afraid to Advocate!

There are many organizations involved in flood risk reduction and flood management - it is not only up to you and your municipality! Here are some ways to be involved in local flood protection measures:

- If you have questions about your local shoreline, contact your <u>local</u>
   Conservation Authority.
- Email your Member of Provincial
   Parliament (MPP) in Ontario and
   Member of Parliament (MP) in Canada.
   Let them know that extreme weather,
   water level variability, storm surge, and
   flooding may pose significant issues.
   Also, that they should work with all
   levels of government to consider
   adaptation solutions, such as financial
   compensation for homeowners or
   management of the highest-risk areas.
