The guide includes sources of funding from various levels of government, non-profit organizations, charities and wish foundations.

The contact information is listed for each agency and/or source which provides the funding, with a description of the purpose of the funds, a summary of the eligibility criteria, and instructions on how to apply for or get more information on the funding.

Some funding sources were excluded because application for their funding is made through service provider agencies.

Tips When Accessing Private Medical Benefits

Families are encouraged to look into their private benefits and insurance for coverage for Nursing, Personal Support Worker (PSW), Psychology (psychological assessments), Therapies, Medication and Equipment. It is important to ask the insurance company if they cover the item and all of the required documentation that will need to be provided in order for the item to be covered.

For **Therapies** the following questions should be asked of the benefit/insurance program:

- What type of therapy is covered (Speech, Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy, Psychology/Psychological Assessment)?
- What is the amount covered?
- Is the amount covered per year or per life time?
- What medical documentation is required (e.g. Doctor's referral/forms)? Ask for specific criteria that needs to be included.

For Nursing and Personal Support Worker the following questions should be asked of the benefit/insurance program:

- What type of nursing care is covered? (Registered Nurse, Registered Practical Nurse)
- What is the amount covered (is there a restriction on the amount per hour)?
- Is the amount covered per year or per life time?
- Is it a requirement to use an agency or is a private service permitted?
- What medical documentation is required (e.g. Doctor's letter/forms)? Ask for specific criteria that needs to be included.

For **Equipment and Supplies** (including wheelchairs, walkers, standers, hospital beds, enteral supplies, elemental formulas, bath seats, incontinence supplies, orthotics) the following questions should be asked of the benefit/insurance program

- Is the specific item covered?
- Medical documentation that is required (ask for specific criteria that needs to be included in the letter)
- Does the child have to be tube fed for formula to be covered?
- Does the formula need to be a meal substitute, replacement or sole source of nutrition?
- Does the product need to be purchased or is renting possible if needed for short-time use (e.g. hospital bed or wheelchair post-surgery)?
- Are the remaining funds covered for items once families have exhausted government funding? (e.g. the additional cost of enteral supplies after ADP or for incontinence supplies after Easter Seals portion is paid)

This non-profit foundation provides financial assistance to children who are physically and/or mentally challenged, after all other sources have been exhausted. The foundation has two programs: Kids Life-Line and Angel Hair for Kids. It provides assistance for families who are financially disadvantaged.

Kids Life-Line:

This program provides one-time financial assistance for necessary products and services such as transportation costs, limited in-home nursing, counselling or therapy, groceries, parking permits, medication or medical/dental supplies that are not covered by the government or insurance.

Angel Hair for Kids:

This program provides wigs and hair-loss solutions to financially disadvantaged children who have lost their hair due to a medical condition or treatment.

To apply for assistance, a health or social care professional must contact the foundation for an intake request package. This package must be filled out and submitted by the health or social care provider. The foundation reviews each request on an individual basis. To request an intake application email: admin@acvf.ca

Aaron's Apple provides direct funds to the SickKids Patient Amenities Fund for medications, specialized formulas, nutritional supplements, supplies and equipment that are related to medications for children who are seriously and chronically ill.

To be eligible, the child must have a serious illness (e.g. Cancer, Ulcerative Colitis, Liver Transplant, Diabetes, Crohn's), be 18 years of age or younger, have extraordinary costs which are a direct result of the child's illness and has used up all other available financial resources.



Access 2 Entertainment is a non-profit organization that gives individuals with a disability a card that provides a support person with free admission or a significant discount on admission to various entertainment venues in Canada. The individual with a disability will pay regular admission. Venues include movie theatres, Metro Toronto Zoo, Ontario Place, Ontario Science Centre and more. There is a \$20 fee to acquire the card and it will be valid for 3 years and \$30 for 5 years.

To be eligible, a person with a permanent disability must require a support person when attending a movie or other entertainment venues. No age restrictions apply.

ACSD funding is a benefit that is paid monthly to families with a child with a disability. It is meant to help with the extraordinary costs that families have, due to the disability. Extraordinary costs may include: special clothing and diets, special learning or developmental equipment, babysitting, specialized childcare, special camps, transportation to the doctor, clinic, or hospital, and parent relief. The benefit also provides funds for eye glasses, dental and drug benefits for the child, as well as hearing aids and repairs to hearing aids.

To be eligible, parents or guardians must have a child with a disability who is under the age of 18 years and lives at home. The amount of funding a family may receive is calculated based on the total family income and the ongoing extraordinary costs and difficulties related to the care of the child with the disability.

The ADP covers up to 75% of the costs of equipment and other devices that will help people with a long-term physical disability increase their independence and quality of life. Social assistance benefits under Ontario Works (OW), Ontario Disability Support Program (ODSP), Assistance for Children with Severe Disabilities (ACSD), private insurance and other sources may cover the additional 25%. Types of equipment covered include: communication devices, diabetes equipment, hearing aids, home oxygen, orthoses, ostomy supplies, prosthetic devices, visual aids, wheelchairs, etc.

To be eligible, Ontario residents must have a valid Health Card and have had a physical disability for six months or longer. There are no limits to funding based on personal income.

A doctor or health care professional will make a referral to a registered authorizer who will approve the assistive device and submit the application.

Autism Ontario provides funding through the March Break Reimbursement Fund and the One-to-One Summer Support Worker Reimbursement Fund to families with children who have been diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder.





The March Break Reimbursement Fund:

This program provides up to \$350 for families who either retain the services of a one-to-one support worker or pay for a March Break camp/program for their child/youth with ASD. To be eligible, an individual must be 18 years or younger and have an official diagnosis of ASD. Applications are accepted for a limited time period between December and January.

The One-to-One Summer Support Worker Reimbursement Fund:

This program provides up to \$600 to Ontario families of children with ASD who attain the services of a one-to-one support worker for their child to attend a community summer camp or summer program. To be eligible, a child must be under the age of 18 years and have a documented diagnosis of ASD by a professional. Applications are accepted for a limited time period in Spring.

All application forms can be obtained online.

Please note: Autism Ontario does not accept applications all year for these programs. Please refer to their website for specific dates and deadlines to apply.

This program provides funding for renovations for children and families in need of accessibility, safety, and security in the home.

Anyone can refer a child for funding however the child's parents or legal guardians must communicate their interest for support, directly to The Baeumler Family Foundation.

To apply, send a Letter of Interest which includes the specific request within the home and the child's history related to their physical, emotional and mental health. If chosen for further consideration, the individual will be invited to submit a Full Proposal that will consist of a more detailed application.

The CCB (formerly known as the "Baby Bonus" and also replacing the Universal Child Care Benefit) is a tax-free benefit paid monthly to help eligible families with the costs of raising and meeting the daily needs of a child. It is targeted to those who need it most.

To be eligible, you must be a Canadian Citizen and primarily responsible for the care and upbringing of a child who lives with you and is under the age of 18 years. The benefit a family may receive is calculated based on the total family income and number of children in your care.

You should apply when: your child is born, you become a Canadian Citizen, and/or a child begins living with you. If you are a mother of a newborn, you may apply through the Automated Benefits Application when you sign your child's birth registration. Otherwise, you must fill out **Form RC66** (Canada Child Benefits Application) and return it to your local tax office. This form can be obtained <a href="https://example.com/heres/benefits/her

The Government deposits money into your RDSP. Matching grants of up to 300%, depending on the amount contributed and the Beneficiary's Family Income, may be provided. The maximum is \$3,500 each year, with a limit of \$70,000 over your lifetime.

To be eligible, you must meet the following criteria: make contributions to your RDSP, be 49 years of age or under, be a Canadian resident, have a Social Insurance Number and be eligible for the Disability Tax Credit. Parents/guardians opening an RDSP for their child (under 18 years of age), must have filed their taxes for the past 2 years and all future years.

You must apply for the RDSP, Canada Disability Savings Bond and Canada Disability Savings Grant at a participating Financial Organization where you want your RDSP to be opened. Canadian Tire Jumpstart[®] is a community-based charitable program that helps children in financial need participate in organized sports and recreational activities. Funded activities can include scouts, girl guides, hockey, dance, soccer, swimming, yoga etc., but do not include summer or day camps. A maximum of \$300 per

submission (\$600 maximum per year) per child may be supported. Costs for equipment and transportation can also be covered in addition to the registration fees.

To be eligible, a child must be between the ages of 4 and 18 years. A financial assessment, including details about your family and desired choice of activity, may also be required.

Applications are accepted between January 15th and November 1st, with the goal of the funding to be equitably distributed over spring/summer and fall/winter activities. The mission of Ceridian Cares is to improve the quality of life in our communities. It provides grants to any family in need. Grants typically range from \$200 to \$4000.

To be eligible, the child must be a Canadian resident and meet eligibility criteria based on total household income as listed below. There are two types of grants:

Basic Essentials Grant:

This grant will fund items such as: clothing, footwear, food and basic household needs, prosthetics, eyewear, medical equipment, special therapies, home adjustments for barrier free living, respite services, braille materials, counseling services and physiotherapy. Employment Insurance (EI) provides a benefit for up to 35 weeks for a parent, stepparent, foster parent or legal guardian to provide care or support to a critically ill child. It is a special benefit called Parents of Critically III Children (PCIC). A qualified health practitioner must issue a certificate stating the period during which the child will require care or support.

A critically ill child is a child who has a life-threatening illness or injury, that can include various acute phases of illness and for which continued parental care or support is required. This does not include a child with a chronic illness or condition that is their normal state of health. There must be a significant change from the child's normal or baseline state of health at the time they are assessed by a specialist medical doctor.

The Disability Tax Credit (DTC) is a non-refundable tax credit that reduces the amount of income tax paid.

To be eligible, a person must have a severe and prolonged mental or physical impairment that greatly restricts his or her activities of daily living. Impairments may include a cognitive, vision and/or hearing impairment, motor restrictions, and the need for life sustaining therapy. The impairment must last for a continuous period of at least 12 months and be certified on a DTC Certificate (form T2201) by a qualified medical practitioner.

To receive the tax credit, you must complete Form T2201. The applicant completes Part A of the form and a doctor or qualified professional completes and signs Part B of the form. If a disability is permanent, it is not necessary to re-apply each year. The file is reviewed every three years.

The Disability Travel Card provides an identification card to a person with a permanent disability, which will allow an adult attendant, travelling with the person with a disability, to travel at no cost by train or bus. (For airline travel, contact the airline in which you wish to travel with and inform them that the individual has a disability and will require the support of an attendant). The person with the disability pays regular admission. An attendant is an individual who accompanies a person with a permanent disability who cannot travel independently.

Only persons with a permanent disability who require a support person when travelling can apply for the card. There are no age restrictions. (Please note: Via Rail only provides a discount for people with a disability over the age of 13. Anyone under the age of 13 would not be allowed to travel without an attendant).



The person with a disability will apply for the Disability Travel Card by completing and mailing in a following application form.



Some children under the age of 3 may be eligible, depending on their diagnosis (for example, Spina Bifida or Prune Belly Syndrome). Enhanced Respite Funding is a grant paid for respite to eligible families who are caring for a child who is medically fragile and/or depends on a technological device. Examples of medical and technological equipment include: mechanical ventilators, apnea monitors, renal dialysis, urinary catheters, colostomy bags, intravenous drugs, tracheotomy tubes care, suctioning, oxygen support or tube feeding. Families may be eligible for up to \$3,500 per child, per year. There are no restrictions on the type of respite a family may purchase. Funds may be used flexibly to purchase in-home or out-of-home services or a combination of in-home and out-of-home services.

To be eligible, a child must be 18 years or younger and have care requirements resulting from medical or physiological condition(s) that require ongoing, frequent or time-consuming caregiver intervention and monitoring on a 24-hour basis for survival. In addition, children must fall into one of the categories of care requirements.

Note: Children with behavioural disorders alone are not eligible.

A family must be involved with the Central East Local Health Integration Network and apply through their Care Coordinator.





This program provides short term, crisis assistance to children/youth with complex needs and their families. Measureable goals must be developed. The funds are only provided in situations that require supplementary resources beyond the capacity of the system and when all other routes of service planning have been exhausted.

A child/youth must be between birth and 18 years of age with a complex need. A complex need is recognized as being severe or chronic in nature (emotional, developmental disability or terminal illness) and beyond the capacity of the family and local services, requiring an integrated service approach that may cross sectors, and needing immediate measures to decrease the risk of the immediate health and safety of the child/youth. The child must reside and be accessing services within Durham Region.

Healthy Smiles Ontario (HSO) is a free (government-funded), basic dental program for children and youth. Services covered include: regular check-ups to a licensed dental provider (e.g. dentist or dental hygienist), dental services including cleaning, fillings, xrays, scaling and urgent or emergency oral health issues.

To be eligible, your child must be 17 years of age or younger, an Ontario resident and members of the household meet the income eligibility requirement. Children are automatically eligible and are enrolled when they or their family receive Ontario Works, Temporary Care Assistance, Assistance for Children with Severe Disabilities or the Ontario Disability Support Program. Families that have other dental insurance are not automatically excluded.

To access the program, contact your dentist to see if they participate in the HSO program. If you do not have a dentist, contact the Durham Region Health Department, Oral Health Division at 1-866-853-1326 or at the above website.

The Community Development Council of Durham provides low income Durham residents with assistance related to housing stability including: emergency-related hydro or gas arrears, rental arrears and last month's rent. This is a short-term program assessed on a case-by-case basis. Tenants must live in a unit that is usually affordable to them.

The CDCD will require identification from all household members occupying the unit, proof of rental arrears/utility arrears/need to move or obtain last month's rent, copy of most recent bank statement and a signed housing Stability Application. In the case of rental arrears the landlord will be contacted. Financial eligibility is based on the LICO (Low Income Cut-Off) chart and requires the applicant to exhaust all other opportunities for financial assistance.

Income Support Program:

This program provides financial assistance through Ontario Works. Income Support (Ontario Works) helps with the costs of basic needs (e.g. food, clothing, shelter). It also assists eligible families with housing, dental care fees, drug card for prescribed medication, prescribed equipment, etc.

To be eligible for Income Support (Ontario Works), you must live in Ontario, need money right away to help pay for food and shelter, and be willing to take part in activities to find a job.

Health-related <u>mandatory benefits</u> include: prescription drug coverage, vision care (child), dental care (child), diabetic supplies, surgical supplies/dressings, medical transportation costs \$15 and over, consumer contribution for assistive devices,



batteries and necessary repairs for mobility devices, Guide Dog Benefit, and advance (up front) child care.

Health-related <u>discretionary benefits</u> may be provided to eligible recipients. These include: dental and vision care for adults, prosthetic appliances, funerals and burials, heating payments and payments for low-cost heating energy conservation measures. As well, non-health-related benefits may include: vocational training and retraining, travel and transportation that is not for health-related purposes, moving expenses any other special service, item or payment authorized by the Director.

Employment Support

JACC provides support to children who are seriously ill or have a permanent disability. Eligible requests for assistance may include: emergency financial relief directly related to the child's disability, hospital and medical costs, 1:1 respite worker for a predetermined period of time, speech/occupational/physical therapy, sibling care, special formula, prescription medication, disposable medical and feeding supplies.

To be eligible the child must be 18 years of age or younger and have a serious illness and/or have a permanent disability. The following diagnoses qualify for funding: **physical disability, severe medical issues** (that cannot be controlled by medication and disrupts the life of the child and family and/or **mental health disorders**. Extraordinary costs must be present which are incurred directly as a result of the child's diagnosis. The family's combined gross annual household income must be \$60,000 or less. An exception to income will <u>only</u> be considered if there is more than one child with special needs in the family.

This is a tax credit associated with the extraordinary costs directly related to a disability. Items may be claimed as medical expenses on one's yearly income tax return. Examples of medical expenses may include: prescribed medications, home renovations, glasses, hearing aids, meals and transportation to appointments, artificial limbs, orthotics, medical supplies/equipment, therapies (e.g. ABA, physiotherapy, osteopathy, occupational therapy, speech therapy), hospital services, etc.

To claim this tax credit, you must fill out **Line 330 and 331** of your Schedule One, Federal Tax form. Please see the website listed above for a list of eligible medical expenses.

To be eligible a child must be between the ages of 4 and 18 years and have a serious, chronic, or life-threatening medical condition. The child must not have had a wish granted by any other wish-granting organization in the past.

Ontario Drug Benefit

This program provides Ontario residents with financial assistance if they have high prescription drug costs in relation to their net household income. The program helps cover the cost of prescription drug products listed on the Ontario Drug Benefit Formulary/Comparative Drug Index. Drug products that are not listed on the Formulary will be considered through the Ministry's Exceptional Access Program on a case-by-case basis.

To be eligible, you must be a resident of Ontario, have a valid Ontario Health Card, and do not qualify for drug coverage from another Ontario Drug Benefit source. Also, you must not have private insurance coverage or if you do, the private insurance does not cover 100% of your prescription drug costs.

Please note: You will pay a set amount of your prescription drug costs each year. The amount of your deductible is based on your household income and equals about 4% of your household's combined net income. Payments are split into four equal amounts over the year starting on August 1st. You pay your deductible by purchasing ODB approved prescription drug products at your pharmacy. Once you have purchased enough of these products to equal the amount of your deductible, then the ODB program pays for most of the cost of your drugs.

Nutrition Products

Nutrition products (formula) may be reimbursed when the cost is exceptional relative to the cost of regular formula.

To be eligible, the formula must be prescribed by the child's doctor and be the sole source of nutrition as the result of one of the following: disorders resulting in esophageal dysfunction, dysphagia, maldigestion, malabsorption or those requiring a chemically defined diet. 
