- Infants and young children from birth to school entry:
 - who have a developmental disability or are at risk of developmental delay
 - who are born prematurely and have developmental concerns
 - who have experienced medical challenges early in life

What We Do

Prevention and Intervention

- Meet with families in their home to discuss concerns and observe their child's development
- Share strategies and practical suggestions to enhance developmental skills within their daily routines
- Provide coaching, consultation and support to help families achieve their goals

Screening and Assessments

- Gather information about a child's unique strengths and needs using formal and informal assessments
- Involve parents in all aspects of assessment to support them in decision making
- Plan for transition to childcare, school or another service

Information and Support

- Provide support during challenging times
- Support parents to make informed decisions
- Share information and resources

Service Coordination

- Offer information about other early years programs and services
- Assist families to access services and funding as needed
- Collaborate with other professionals and services with the family's consent
