Concise description of the corrective measures required:

- Operator to properly clean and disinfect all reusable equipment after each use
- Operator to ensure ear piercing instruments are only used on the fleshy part of the ear lobes
- For ear lobe piercing, operator to ensure skin is cleaned with an approved skin antiseptic, mark skin, let mark dry, and then clean skin again with antiseptic
- Operator to ensure client aftercare instructions contain all required information
- Operator to record all accidental blood and body fluid exposures with all required information
- Operator to maintain all invasive procedure records with all required information
