COVID-19 Vaccine Booking for Adults 80 Years and Older

Individuals over the age of 80, born in 1941 or earlier, can begin registering for Pfizer vaccine through the online booking system at durham.ca/vaccineappointment on Monday, March 8 for appointments that start on Tuesday, March 9. Seniors who are unable to use the online booking system are invited to call the Call Centre Booking Line at 1-800-841-2729 to register.

- **Monday, March 8 at 8 a.m.:** Online and phone Registration is open to Durham residents over the age of 80 (born in 1941 or earlier).
- **Tuesday, March 9:** Appointments begin at Garnet B. Rickard Recreation Complex in Clarington; or the Chestnut Hills Development Recreation Complex in Pickering.

Pickering and Clarington Clinic Hours (March 9 – 13)

- March 9 - 1:30 pm – 8:30 (evening)
- March 10 - 9:30 am – 4:30 pm (day)
- March 11 - 1:30 pm – 8:30 (evening)
- March 12 - 9:30 am – 4:30 pm (day)
- March 13 - 1:30 pm – 8:30 (evening)
- **Effective March 14** all clinic hours will be 10:30 am to 8:30 pm

The Oshawa clinic site (at Durham College and Ontario Tech University) is currently completing vaccination for health care providers and we expect will transition to those over 80 years of age early next week at which time we will notify health care providers and the public.

The Health Department, along with community partners, is also planning to offer mobile clinics to provide vaccine to populations and individuals who may have difficulty accessing larger clinics. More details regarding mobile clinics will be available in the coming weeks.

Additional municipal locations will be opening in the coming days and weeks depending on vaccine availability. We will provide opening and booking information as soon as it is available. You can see the list of current municipal sites at durham.ca/covidvaccines.
