COVID-19 Vaccine: Moderna Supply Update

Please be advised that as of **June 19, 2025, all Moderna COVID-19 vaccines across Ontario will be expired.** Continue to check the expiry on all Moderna doses, as some lots expire **prior to June 19**.

Recommendations for Immunocompromised Children 6 Months to 11 Years

Eligible individuals aged 6 months to 11 years **who are moderately to severely immunocompromised** are encouraged to **receive their spring dose of COVID-19 vaccine as soon as possible** before the Moderna supply expires. After June 19, 2025, there will be no vaccine available for this population until Fall 2025.

Recommendations for Individuals Aged 12 and Older

The Pfizer vaccine remains available for eligible individuals aged 12 years and older. The Spring COVID-19 vaccine program will **conclude on June 30**, **2025** (vaccination may continue to be received until August 31). For doses after June 30, healthcare providers should use discretion to determine the benefit of receiving dose(s) at the minimum interval versus receiving dose(s) during the next annual COVID-19 vaccine program.

Healthcare providers should plan immunization schedules and client outreach accordingly to ensure eligible individuals receive their COVID-19 vaccine this spring.

Individuals eligible for a Spring COVID-19 vaccine can access the vaccine through local pharmacies. Durham Region Health Department offers limited COVID-19 vaccine appointments for high-risk children under 5 years of age if there is no local pharmacy in their community vaccinating young children (visit <u>https://durhamvaccinebooking.ca</u> to book an appointment).
