COVID-19 Vaccines Available Now for High-Risk Groups

The COVID-19 vaccine program has transitioned to an annual program with guidance issued each fall for the September to August respiratory season with immunizations provided at specified schedules and timing. Vaccines are available now for high-risk groups and priority populations.

Eligibility

Individuals in High-Risk Group 1 should receive a vaccine in the fall AND spring:

- Adults 80 years and older; 65 to 79 years of age should receive a dose now and may receive an
 additional dose in the spring
- · Adult residents of long-term care homes and other congregate living settings for seniors
- Individuals 6 months of age and older who are <u>moderately to severely immunocompromised</u> (due to specific underlying condition or treatment)
- Individuals 55 years and older who identify as First Nations, Inuit, or Metis and their non-Indigenous household members who are 55 years and older

Individuals in High-Risk Group 2 should receive a vaccine in the fall only:

- Residents in long-term care homes and other congregate living settings aged 17 years and under
- Pregnant individuals
- Individuals from First Nations, Métis and Inuit communities who are aged 54 years and under
- Members of underserved communities
- Health care workers and other care providers in facilities and community settings as per NACI

The following priority populations may receive a vaccine in the fall:

- Children 6 months to 4 years of age
- Individuals with significant exposure to birds or mammals through interactions with birds or mammals (e.g. poultry, livestock, slaughterhouse/processing plant workers, wildlife officers/researchers, and veterinarians)

General population, 6 months of age and older, who do not belong to the above populations may receive a vaccine in the fall, **starting on October 27, 2025.**

Not all vaccine brands and/or formats may always be available. Products may be substituted based on supply. Health care providers should use the vaccine (according to the products' age indications) that is available unless the patient has a medical contraindication toward a specific vaccine. Individuals unable to receive an mRNA vaccine may be eligible for other treatment options to reduce the duration and severity of illness.

The COVID-19 vaccines may be given at the same time with other vaccines, or at any time before or after other non-COVID-19 vaccines (live or non-live vaccines), including influenza vaccine, respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) vaccine and/or the RSV monoclonal antibody, Beyfortus[®].

COVID-19 Vaccine Ordering and Availability

Onboarded sites providing COVID-19 vaccines can order vaccine using the <u>New Online Seasonal Vaccine Order Form</u> (<u>durham.ca/hcp</u> > Forms > Order). If your organization would like to start offering COVID-19 vaccine, visit <u>durham.ca/hcp</u> (Respiratory Illnesses>COVID-19) to start the onboarding process.

Individuals six months and older can receive the COVID-19 vaccine through participating health care providers and pharmacies. Visit the COVID-19 Pharmacy Locator Tool ontario.ca/vaccine-locations/ for pharmacy locations. Limited Health Department COVID-19 vaccine clinic appointments are available for eligible children 6 months to 4 years of age who cannot be vaccinated at local pharmacies. Appointments will be available soon and can be booked online. Visit www.durham.ca/COVIDvaccines for more information.

Vaccine order notifications will be sent by email. Orders will be ready for pick-up within 7–10 business days. To prevent delays during pick up, please ensure your vaccine cooler is prepared according to vaccine storage and handling guidelines.
