
Back-up Plan Tips

- Back-up sites must have a regulated, monitored fridge
- Consider sites with back-up generators
- Call local pharmacies, hospitals and other facilities to ask if they can be your back-up
- Ensure you have a cooler, ice packs, thermometer, spare battery and flashlight to move the vaccine
- Different fridges hold the temperature for different periods of time. Get to know your own fridge to anticipate how long it will hold a temperature of +2°C to +8°C

Have a Back-up Plan!

Protect Your Vaccine
During a Power Outage

TAKE ACTION TO PROTECT YOUR VACCINES

STEP 1

- Record current time and fridge temperature (Max, Min and Current) in log book
- Record "Power Outage" on log book
- Call Local Power Company to ask when power will be back on



STEP 2

If Less than 4 hours...

- Keep fridge door closed and monitor temperature
- If temperature is increasing prepare to move vaccine to back-up site OR proceed to Step #3

If More than 4 hours...

- Take vaccine to back-up site in cooler (with icepacks and Max/Min thermometer)
- At back-up site, monitor temperature with Max/Min Thermometer



STEP 3

If Unable to Transport Vaccine...

- Keep vaccine in fridge (with icepacks if needed) to maintain temperature between +2°C and +8°C
- Keep fridge door closed
- Keep office temperature low (ie close blinds)
- As soon as possible, take vaccine to a working, monitored fridge

Contact the Durham Region Health Department if the fridge temperature is below +2°C or above +8°C for further assistance.
