Failure

If you answer 'yes' to any of the questions above:

Siblings

Siblings must stay at home until your child showing symptoms tests negative, is cleared by Durham Region Health Department, or is diagnosed with another illness.

When can I return to child care?

If your child, or you as the staff/visitor, test negative

If children and staff/visitors test negative for COVID-19, they may return when: They do not have a fever (without using medication).

- It has been at least 24 hours since symptoms have improved.
- It has been at least 48 hours since gastrointestinal symptoms have improved.
- They were not in close physical contact with someone who currently has COVID-19.

If they test positive

If children or staff/visitors test positive for COVID-19, they can return to care when:

They are cleared by the Durham Region Health Department.

If they do not get tested

If children or staff/visitors choose not to be tested, they must isolate for 10 days. They can return to care when:

- They do not have a fever (without using medication).
- It has been at least 24 hours since symptoms have improved.
- It has been at least 48 hours since gastrointestinal symptoms have improved. If they do not talk with a doctor.

If children or staff/visitors choose not to speak with a doctor, they must isolate for 10 days. They can return to care when:

- They do not have a fever (without using medication).
- It has been at 24 hours since symptoms have improved.
- It has been at 48 hours since gastrointestinal symptoms have improved.
