As we move through spring, Ontario continues to experience a surge of new COVID-19 infections. We recognize this new wave continues to challenge us in our desire and efforts to resume normal operations. Several homes are experiencing outbreaks of various size, including Hillsdale Estates, Lakeview Manor and Fairview Lodge. COVID19 Antiviral Treatment Now Available

Paxlovid is an oral antiviral medication that can reduce the risk of hospitalizations or death in people at high risk of serious illness due to COVID-19. Paxlovid must be administered within five days of symptom onset to be effective. Our physicians and nurse practitioners now can arrange for residents to receive the drug should the resident be deemed high risk for a severe outcome. Further information will be provided to you if this is something being considered so that informed consent can be obtained.

Changes to Requirements for Absences

There is no longer a requirement for a resident to quarantine when returning from either a day or overnight absence. Upon return, residents are to be actively screened and must undergo a PCR test on day 5 following the absence.

Mask Wearing

Reminder to all family members and visitors that masks must always remain on when visiting inside the home, including when visiting in the resident room. Eating and drinking with the resident is still not permitted under the Ontario Guidelines. We ask everyone to please ensure to keep our residents, staff, and visitors as safe as possible, and respect the requirement.

I want to thank everyone for your continued support and for remaining vigilant with public health measures, such as screening, testing, masking, and using appropriate personal protective equipment.
