Housing Choice

Residents will choose to live in Beaverton. Lack of income and requiring supports to live with dignity should not preclude Durham residents from choosing where they want to live.



Client Selection

Residents who require supportive housing, who already live in the North and CHOOSE to live in Beaverton's supportive housing building will be given priority. This project provides an option for those already in the north to choose to stay in the north. Clients will be those currently unsheltered or at risk of becoming unsheltered.

Not everyone needs supportive housing and we will continue to serve these clients as we have always done.



Priority for the North but Serving All

While this project will allow those in North Durham, who require supportive housing to stay in north Durham it, like all other housing and homelessness programs will be an option for all Durham residents who need it.



Supportive Housing does not have to be located in Urban Areas

The Provincial Best Practices Guide to Supportive Housing includes ensuring supportive housing is available in a range of settings, including both rural and urban environments.




Expedited but not at the Expense of Due Diligence

Durham's need is urgent – Expedited Process





A home is the first step to a better life.

This project will provide urgently needed housing for those who need extra support and want to use this opportunity as a stepping stone to more independent living, or need ongoing support, and want to live in a rural community.

No one should go to bed without a roof over their head.





Arial Rendering
