What to Expect During your Visit

Outdoor Visits

- You will be screened upon arrival. This will include answering questions.
- Bring your own mask/face covering.
- Two people can visit up to once a week
- Visits are weather dependent.
- Visitor washrooms are not available.

Indoor Visits

- You will be screened upon arrival. This will include answering questions, and providing an attestation of a negative COVID-19 test result in the last two weeks and subsequently not tested positive.
- You will be provided with a surgical mask.
 You will not be able to wear a non-medical mask or face covering.
- Two people can visit up to once a week
- No visitors under the age of twelve.
- Visitor washrooms will be available.
- You will be taken to the area to visit with your loved one.
- You will be asked to hand sanitize before and after your visit.

Essential Caregivers (EC)

Individuals who are not staff and provide care and service to one resident in the home. In many cases, these essential caregivers are family members.

- One visit per resident per week
- Visits will be in the resident room
 Please inquire with the home as to their process for managing Essential Caregivers.

Hand Sanitize

Remember to sanitize your hands before and after visiting your loved one.



Social Distancing

Remember to maintain a safe two metres or six feet distance between you and your loved one unless there is an appropriate plexiglass barrier in place.

Mask Use

Remember to wear a mask at all times when visiting your loved one.




Stay at least six feet or two metres apart from your loved one unless there is an appropriate plexiglass barrier in place.




Things to Remember

- Contact the home to schedule your visit.
- Please arrive five minutes before your scheduled visit time and proceed to the screening area.
- Please keep to the time scheduled for your visit.
- Let the home know if you have to cancel the visit as soon as possible.
- Check with your home regarding what gifts or items you can bring.
- Minimize jewelry and accessories (you may want to leave your coat and/or purse in the car). The fewer items you bring, the lower the risk of virus transfer.
- Should you bring a cell phone, it may be wiped down with a disinfectant.
- Avoid touching your face, eyes or ears, or adjusting your glasses during your visit.
- Pets are not allowed to visit at this time.





- Remember, we are trying to keep everyone safe and healthy. Respect the guidelines that have been put in place and please ask if you do not understand them.
- · Answer screening questions honestly.
- Your visit is limited to your loved one, no other residents.
- Follow all the outlined rules for visiting.
 Non compliance will result in a discontinuation of visits.
- Review the visitor code of conduct and be considerate and respectful when interacting with individuals.
